UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT BOARD OF TRUSTEES

May 22, 2024

The Board of Trustees meeting was called to order at 9:03 a.m. by Board Chair Daniel D. Toscano.

1. Public Participation

3. Hartford Housing

Executive Vice President Geoghegan outlined the Hartford housing plan and the anticipated obligations of the University, which includes signing a 20-year master lease that could result in a \$1.5 million deficit per year. Part of the projected deficit is attributed to subsidizing the cost for students with financial need. Trustee Ritter commented on the enthusiasm from the Hartford community and was confident that philanthropy would close the gap. He also noted the opportunity for naming rights, corporate support, and summer housing needs that would also help close any gap.

On a motion by Trustee Rubin, seconded by Trustee Mehta, the Board voted to provide approval for the Administration to enter into a Term Sheet, Master Lease and other auxiliary and necessary documents to effectuate the development, occupancy, and operation of student housing at 242 Trumbull Street in Hartford, CT.

Trustee Andy Bessette recused himself from the vote.
